We officially opened the Interactive Sensory room in May with local councilor Suzanne Jamal cutting the ribbon!

The benefits of the Interactive Sensory Room will be varied depending on the needs of the particular children.

- The specially designed interactive equipment may help the children to become more aware of their senses and the world around them.
- It may help them in socializing with other children as the equipment may encourage them to explore and move with others.
- It provides a safe place for the children to hone their fine motor skills and practice their movement
- It may help some children to process experiences better and cope with differing situations in a more positive and less extreme way.

The reaction from the children who attend the Interactive Sensory Room regularly has been fantastic and they are benefiting day-on-day from their daily visits. We are very grateful to Meta for looking on our application favourably as the children in Rathfeigh will be the beneficiaries for many, many years to come.

Our multi-sensory room will be used by children with special needs in our school and in the community but also by children who might use the room occasionally in times of stress or anxiety.
